Prayer- Make the sign of the cross and say the Hail Mary together

Recap of last week, we learned who Moses is, that he was a Hebrew man that was adopted as a prince of Egypt and raised as royalty. Moses was chosen by God to lead his people out of slavery in Egypt even though he made a mess out of things before he left Egypt and had to move away. Now we are going to see how God is going to free his people, the Hebrews, with the help of Moses and his brother, Aaron.

Main lesson of this story for our second graders is to know and have exposure to the events of their salvation history, and also to see how God used a flawed man like Moses and his brother, Aaron, to do great things in His name. Even though everything looked impossible to everyone involved, God made everything possible and saved his children even though they were not so sure of the whole business either. They weren't even sure they wanted to escape the comfort of their slavery, even though it was hard work, for a free life unknowing where it would lead. God had to convince both Pharaoh, through Moses, to let the people go *and* convince the Hebrews to follow him out of Egypt.

Exodus 6:28 - 11:9, 12:21-42

Take breaks at intervals to discuss these things with your child. One of the things for them to take note of is that the Egyptians did not know who God is. They worshipped many gods that were not real but they didn't know those gods were not real. Each time our True God showed his power, He was proving to the Egyptians that only the God of Abraham (our God, the great I AM) is God. Pharaoh thought that our God was still one of the many gods and it was to show who was most powerful, but really God was showing that he was the Only God and truly more powerful than anything they could have imagined. But the King was so stubborn, so God had to show His power over and over for the Egyptians to get the message. I daresay that God would have dealt with the Egyptians much nicer if the Pharaoh would have tried to play nice.

The other thing that the kids need to know that is super interesting and important is that all of God's chosen people were saved by the blood of a lamb. A lamb is little and weak and doesn't seem like it is very powerful. But God shows the people that there is power in the most unlikely places. The blood of the lamb is so powerful that it keeps death out and the rest of the lamb is eaten, they have to eat as much as they can because they are going to need this food for the journey they are about to take.

Jesus will be that lamb for us later on in the story of our salvation. One of his names is "the Lamb of God". When Jesus came into the world, he didn't seem that powerful, like a king or a war hero. He was the son of a carpenter. He seemed like a nobody special. But just like that lamb in the story, Jesus showed who He really is and the power that He has when He sacrificed himself for our salvation. The Blood of Christ is so powerful that by His Blood, He has conquered death for us. His Body is our food in the Eucharist and when we eat it, we are given

strength for the journey like the Israelites when they ate the lamb of the first Passover. Strength to walk the path that God has planned for us.

Together go over pages 116-117 in your child's Bible.

Exodus 13:17-14:31

Together go over pages 122-223 in your child's Bible.

Closing prayer- The sign of the cross and the Our Father followed by a blessing on the parent by the child/children.
