BAPTISM IS ONE OF THE 3 SACRAMENTS OF
INITIATION. THE OTHER TWO ARE CONFIRMATION
AND FIRST EUCHARIST. CONFIRMATION LEAVES AN
INDELIBLE (UN-ERASABLE) MARK ON YOUR SOUL
MUCH LIKE BAPTISM AND YOU ALSO RECEIVE AN
INCREASE OF THE GIFTS OF THE SPIRIT.










Why not get Confirmed and Baptized at the same time instead of waiting?





MOST LIKELY, WHEN YOU WERE BAPTIZED. YOUR PARENTS AND YOUR GODPARENTS STOOD FOR YOU AND SPOKE ON YOUR BEHALF. THEY WERE THE ONES PROMISING TO MAKE SURE THAT YOU WERE RAISED IN THE CHURCH AND WOULD BE TAUGHT ABOUT GOD'S LOVE FOR YOU. NOW THAT YOU ARE OLDER AND HAVE BEEN TAUGHT MANY THINGS. YOU ARE OF AGE TO STAND FOR YOURSELF AND PROCLAIM (YES. PROCLAIM!) THAT YOU BELIEVE AND ARE WILLING TO LIVE AS AN ADOPTED CHILD OF GOD AND A CATHOLIC. YOU CANNOT HONESTLY SPEAK FOR YOURSELF IF YOU ARE NOT OLD ENOUGH TO KNOW WHAT THAT MEANS. THIS IS YOUR MOMENT!







We talk about the Holy Spirit a lot this year, but where does Jesus fit into all of this?



EVERYWHERE! THIS YEAR WE LOOKED AT HISTORY'S GOLDEN THREAD AND EVEN THOUGH WE HAVEN'T YET TALKED DIRECTLY ABOUT JESUS AND THE GOOD NEWS OF THE GOSPEL, ALL THE EVENTS WE HAVE STUDIED SO FAR POINTS DIRECTLY TO JESUS AND HIS SACRIFICE AND VICTORY FOR YOU AND FOR US. WHEN GOD THE SON CAME DOWN FROM HIS THRONE TO OUR LEVEL, ALONG WITH ETERNAL SALVATION, HE ALSO SHOWED US HOW TO LIVE AND HOW TO LOVE. HE THEN ESTABLISHED THE CHURCH SO THAT WE WOULD KNOW HOW TO WORSHIP AND HAVE COMMUNITY. WITHOUT THOSE VERY ESSENTIAL GIFTS AND SACRIFICE, WE WOULD FIND IT ALMOST IMPOSSIBLE TO HAVE THE KIND OF RELATIONSHIP WITH GOD THAT WOULD ALLOW US TO OPEN OURSELVES UP TO THE SPIRIT AND ALLOW THE SPIRIT TO WORK IN AND THROUGH US.



When we talk about saints in the Catholic Church, one we can hardly overlook is our Blessed Mother.

In Catholic devotion we tend to focus—as we should—on the relationship between Mary and her divine Son. But Mary also has a special and unique relationship with the third person of the Trinity. As Luke 1:35 informs us, Christ was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit, which came to "overshadow" Mary. This relationship between Mary and the Holy Spirit continues long after the Incarnation, which is why—to take just one example —it's no coincidence that Mary was present, along with the apostles, at the first Pentecost. In True Devotion to the Holy Spirit, Archbishop Luis Martinez writes that both are involved in our sanctification. The Spirit is the Sanctifier by essence while Mary "is the



cooperator, the indispensable instrument." What better way than to learn how to be devoted to the Holy Spirit than from the immaculate virgin whosedevotion was so great she conceived a divine Child through Him? Put another way, true devotion to Mary is true devotion to the Holy Spirit.
