Dear Friends in Christ,

I hope that 2023 is off to a great start for you and your family. This year at St .Charles, we have more than a calendar year number to transition as we enter 2023! We are also transitioning in our liturgical music leadership.

As was shared with you at the end of last year, our longtime musician, Summer Aebker, is relocating to Chicago. With the exception of a few school personnel, Summer is our longest serving employee in the parish. She has been our choir accompanist for more than a quarter century! Over the years she has also directed our children's choir and added her vocals to enrich our liturgies. Since July 2019, when Ruth Fosnaugh retired, Summer has directed all of our liturgical ministries at the parish.

In these past three and a half years, Summer has accomplished much! Even more remarkably, much of the time has been during the added difficulties of covid-19 that made so many of the musical ministries extra challenging.

I will always cherish how Summer and the Worship Commission planned and executed the restoration of our Steinway piano, studied and implemented our lyric screens at Mass, upgraded our

microphones and sound system to a digital format, updated both our hardback and parish hymnals, implemented a concert series, and developed new special liturgies or events such as the Prayer for Christian Unity and Grandparents' Day.

Of course, even with all the new initiatives, Summer was also developing our choirs, cantors, and other ensembles for their primary ministry to be of service at our regular liturgies. During the lockdown in Spring 2020, she kept the music playing and then when possible began the "great restoration" to reassemble again our choirs and musical ensembles.

I know that I am speaking for so many when I offer our thanks to Summer for lifting our hearts and voices musically unto the Lord. There have been so many weddings, funerals, and special liturgies where we have praised the Lord by making a joyful sound in song under Summer's guidance. As she moves forward to a new beginning, we send our thanks and prayers.

At the same time, please help me in welcoming Emily Niese to St Charles. She will receive "the baton" from Summer starting January 2. You can learn more about Emily in the accompanying article. I am grateful to all who helped in the search and selection so that we could have a seamless transition. In particular, I am grateful that Summer will be available yet in January to assist Emily in learning all of the "moving pieces" for our music here at St. Charles.

In fact, I hope that you have marked your calendars for two of our biggest musical offerings of the year. On the weekend of January 21/22 composer and musician Sarah Hart will be at all of our weekend Masses to lead us in song. Then on Sunday evening, January 22, she invites us back for an evening concert at 6:00 pm. Please bring your friends and family members to this special event. Sarah is also partnering with our Women's Walking with Purpose to provide a retreat on Saturday morning, January 21.

The following Saturday, January 28, we are pleased to welcome New York Polyphony to our church for the next Open Hearts Concert. New York Polyphony focuses on the Renaissance and Medieval era of music that is without accompaniment. Four male voices will sing in rich harmonies that will fill our church with beautiful soundscape. The concert is free and we hope that you will invite your friends and family for this special concert.

On a final note, for the time being we are discontinuing our "LifeTeen" Mass on Sunday evenings at 5:30 pm. We will, however, continue to offer our Life Nights and EDGE nights for youth in grades 6-12 on Sunday evenings as scheduled.

Manifesting

The beauty of working at a parish school is hearing the day to day slang/lingo of our students. I recently walked past eighth graders and they were talking about "speaking things into existence" Their conversation resolved around speaking "passing" a test into existence.

Just eavesdropping into the conversation offered a sense of inspiration for my mindset of the church. See, these 13 and 14-year-olds already grasp the power of prayer and manifestation. They just call it by a different expression, "speaking it into existence". I often question myself with this. A lot of times I will say "if that happens" or "it could happen" instead of being definite and saying "it will happen" or "when it happens". The power of prayer and words are understood at the teenage level. Let's apply that to an adult mindset and create it as our mentality.

How can we manifest as a church, as a people? To me the answer is simple. We no longer need to settle for anything! No longer should we accept "I'm trying to show up" from ourselves. No longer should we accept the "maybe next week" from ourselves. It's time we stand on the now and let the future fall into place as it may. Manifesting is saying what you are going to do and doing it. Prayer is manifesting, prayer is the staple of Christianity. Thus, manifesting is true to us at our core.

My dear people, I will leave you with this. Dr. Denis Waitley once said "When you visualize, then you materialize. If you've been there in the mind, you'll go there in the body." If we want our parish to grow we have to visualize where we want to be, then we will materialize where we want to be, then we will be where we want it to be.

Over the course of the last couple of weeks, Father Kent and I have been talking to different classes here at St. Charles in order to prepare them for the Sacrament of Reconciliation this Advent season. During my time with them, I learned that almost every single student feels like they do not have enough time to just relax and play. They go from a full day at school, to some sort of after school activity, then dinner, if they have time and probably while they are doing homework, and finally straight to bed. Then it's rinse and repeat the next day.

As parents, we have to recognize how they are feeling, because I am pretty sure we are feeling the exact same way.

Our culture wants us to believe that this is the path to success. It wants us to think that if we are not constantly busy that there is no way we can be viewed as being successful. We worry that we might be labeled as lazy or unmotivated, or worse yet, that our kids will be labeled as such. This is a problem. I heard it said at a conference, if we are busy, that is just another way of Being Under Satan's Yoke. If we do not push the pause button on our

hectic lives, and those of our kids, we could be pushing ourselves towards mental, emotional, physical and spiritual problems.


Now, I am not saying that you should slack in your particular vocation; what I am saying is that God knows we are busy and He wants us to take time to replenish ourselves. We need only to look at God's example, He even took a day of rest: "And on the seventh day God finished his work which he had done, and he rested on the seventh day from all his work which he had done. So God blessed the seventh day and hallowed it, because on it God rested from all his work which he had done in creation." (Gen 2:2-3)

As a matter of fact, the Church recognizes this need for rest. Grab your Catechism and look at paragraph 2042; you will find that this is the first precept: "You shall attend Mass on Sundays and on holy days of obligation and rest from servile labor." Then jump to CCC 2184-2188 and you see that as Catholics we are called to have a day of grace and rest from work. These days help everyone to enjoy the proper amount of rest and leisure and promote family, social, and religious lives.

We need to find the balance between work and rest, not only for ourselves, but also for our children. We need to stop Being Under Satan's Yoke. Now, as we enter into this new year, I invite you to look at how you and your family are living your life. See if you can find that balance because in that balance we can have a healthier mental, emotional, physical and spiritual life.

I will leave you with a prayer for a busy life from St. Teresa of Avila.

"I know that you are constantly beside me, yet I am usually so busy that I ignore you. If you want me to remain so busy, please force me to think about and love you even in the midst of such hectic activity. If you do now want me so busy, please release me from it, showing others how they can take over my responsibilities."



Once again, Happy New Year and best wishes for a successful and healthy year ahead!






