
## A Note on this Issue of The Chimes

Dear Friends in Christ,

Sometimes the timing does go as planned. That was the case with our Christmas gift for all who came and offered the holy sacrifice of the Mass this Christmas at St. Charles.

Weeks before Christmas I had ordered 2,000 prayer cards from the Sisters of Life in New York. Apparently that was a rather large order which prompted a call to say that they just barely had enough to fulfill the order. They assured me they would arrive before Christmas.

Well, as of 3:00 pm when I went over to church to prepare for the first Mass at 4:00 pm they had not yet

arrived. I explained during the Mass what had happened and why "Santa" had no holy cards to share this Christmas.

When I returned to the rectory for a simple Christmas evening supper between the two Masses, what did I find? The package from the sisters had arrived! The large box was brimming with the prayer cards I had ordered weeks prior. Yes, the Sisters of Life are true to their word!

Unfortunately, Fr. Bertholy did not realize when he brought the package into the rectory what it was. Yet, I know that God always has a larger plan than the one I am plotting. So, rather than share these prayer cards on the first day of the Christmas season, we will share them on the last day of the season, The Baptism of the Lord. This year, that feast (three Sundays after Christmas) falls on Sunday, January 11. If you are reading this prior to that date, please come and offer the holy sacrifice of the Mass that weekend and receive the gift!

As we enter into this new year of the Lord 2026, I hope that you will be ready to receive the generosity of the Lord in your life. The gifts can come in any form, at any time, and from God at work in anyone around us.

I would like to take this time to thank Cathy Huber who has for many years carefully organized and carried through the production of *The Chimes* so beautifully for us six times a year. She was unable to organize this January issue, so please bear with us if it looks different or does not have its typical flair! We have certainly learned how much goes into producing these issues—it doesn't come together on its own!

Since I am writing this letter a few days after Christmas, I would like to take this opportunity to thank our many liturgical ministers who went over and above to make our Christmas liturgies beautiful and hospitable. The list certainly includes our musicians

and singers (who started rehearsing several weeks prior), sacristans, lectors, altar servers, ushers, and greeters. We would be amiss if we forgot the banner crew and flower power people who made the church (inside and out) look festive and inviting. Finally, let's not overlook our regular maintenance personnel who keep things tidy and clean!

I would also like to recognize the hard work with our outreach ministries in the lead-up to Christmas. Thanks to the Stolly family and a whole new roster of volunteers and leaders, Give-A-Christmas was there to help feed the hungry in our community. Christian Corner Community Center, under the dedicated leadership of Maureen Kaskel and so many volunteers from within our parish and beyond, was there to make Christmas merry and bright thanks to the donations from our Advent Tree of Hope. Of course St. Vincent de Paul, Connecting Borders, and so many other great efforts have helped ease the burden families face this time of year.

In closing, I want to also give a "shout out" to the many ministry leaders at work year-round in our parish. Save the Date! The 2026 Parish Mission will be March 22-24. This year the mission will take place over the course of 3 days at St. Charles. The theme this year is "Unity as a Journey of the Heart". The featured speaker will be Deacon Art Miller. We hope you will join us for a time of strengthening each other as soldiers for Christ. Here is more of a breakdown of each day:

## Day 1 – Healing the Divided Heart

- Recognizing our own brokenness and need for God's unifying grace.
- Theme: *"That they may be one in us"* (John 17:21).
- Message: Unity begins with personal conversion and reconciliation with God.



## Day 2 – Breaking Down the Walls

- Facing divisions of race, class, and history with the Gospel of reconciliation.
- Theme: *"We, though many, are one body in Christ"* (Romans 12:5).
- Message: Christ calls us to see beyond barriers and live as one family.

## Day 3 – Building Bridges of Hope

- Commissioning participants to become bridge-builders in their families, parishes, and communities.
- Theme: *"Blessed are the peacemakers"* (Matthew 5:9).
- Message: True unity leads us outward in mission, building the Kingdom of God.

## Anointing of the Sick

Illness and suffering are a fact of life, and the Church walks alongside those who are sick, undergoing treatment for illness or are dying. We know that in Christ Jesus, we have a God who understands human suffering, as He Himself suffered.

In earlier times, the Church reserved anointing for those at the point of death. However, a deeper understanding of human frailty and the healing brought about by this sacrament means that the Anointing of the Sick is now offered to anyone undergoing a serious illness, those facing surgery, the elderly and those who are dying.

The priest lays his hands on the person receiving this sacrament, then anoints them with blessed oil. The Church asks that God give strength to the person who is sick and that they be more closely united with Christ in their suffering. Healing, if it is God's will, is requested as well. The Church offers particular solace to those who are dying.

Welcome to the Church family! Please contact the Parish Office to schedule a Baptism at least a month in advance. If this is your first child's baptism, there is required preparation. You are welcome to begin this before the birth of your child.

### Marriage

Recently engaged? Please contact the Parish Office at least six months prior to your desired date to reserve the church and begin your preparations with the Pastor.
